Key Terms: Residential address is where you live, in order to be eligible for an Ulster County ballot you must reside within Ulster County. Mailing address is if you have a different address other than your residence where you receive mail, inclusive of PO boxes.

Who may apply for an absentee ballot?

Each person must apply for themselves. It is a felony to make a false statement in an application for an absentee ballot, to attempt to cast an illegal ballot, or to help anyone to cast an illegal ballot.

Information for military and overseas voters:

If you are applying for an absentee ballot because you or your family are in the military or because you currently reside overseas, do not use this application. You are entitled to special provisions if you apply using the Federal Postcard Application. Where and when to return your application:

Applications must be received fifteen days before the election, or hand-delivered to your county board of elections by the day before the election.

Options available to you if you have an illness or disability:

If you check the box indicating your illness or disability is permanent, once your application is approved you will automatically receive a ballot for each election in which you are eligible to vote, without having to apply again. You may sign the absentee ballot application yourself, or you may make your mark and have your mark witnessed in the spaces provided on the bottom of the application. Please note that a power of attorney is not allowed any voting purpose. If you require an accessible ballot please visit: <https://absenteeballot.elections.ny.gov/home/accessible>

When your ballot will be sent:

Your absentee ballot materials will be sent to you beginning 46 days before federal, state, county, city or town elections in which you are eligible to vote. If you applied after this date, your ballot will be sent immediately after your completed and signed application is received and processed by your local board of elections. If you provide dates in sections 3 and/or 4 identifying the time frame within which you will be absent from your county or from the City of New York, you will be sent a ballot for any primary, general, special election or presidential primary election which might occur during the time frame you have specified. If you prefer, you may designate someone to pick up your ballot for you, by completing the required information in sections 3 and/or 4 as appropriate. Contact your local county board of elections if you have not received your ballot.

COVID-19 Considerations:

Chapter 139 of the Laws of 2020 authorizes voters to request an absentee due to risk of illness, including COVID. The effective date is January 21, 2022 and it expires December 31, 2022.

Cures Process:

In the event that your application and/or returned voted ballot is deemed to be insufficient you will be contacted to cure any deficiencies with guidance from the Board of Elections. Please provide a reliable form of contact (email/ phone) in section 1 to expedite this process.

Changes to absentee canvassing process effective April 1, 2022:

Once your absentee ballot is issued you will no longer be afforded the opportunity to cast an in person voting system ballot at any of our early voting or election day poll sites. If an absentee voter seeks an in person ballot they will be given the chance to vote by affidavit ballot at the poll site.
